Attachment-Based Family Therapy (ABFT) is an empirically supported, trust-based, emotion-focused psychotherapy model designed to improve family and individual processes associated with adolescent suicide and depression. Its goal is to repair interpersonal ruptures, and rebuild an emotionally protective parent-child relationship.

Guy Diamond, Ph.D.

Dr. Guy Diamond is Professor Emeritus at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine and Associate Professor at Drexel University where he is also the Director of the Center for Family

Intervention Science (CFIS). Dr. Diamond is the primary developer of Attachment-Based Family Therapy. Along with his co-authors, Dr. Gary Diamond and Dr. Suzanne Levy, Dr. Diamond has written the first book on ABFT, *Attachment-Based Family Therapy for Depressed Adolescents*, published by the American Psychological Association.
