MCA begins operating from the Bath Youth Meeting House and Skate Park.

2016

In July, parent and business owner Jamie Dorr convened a group of five Greater Bath community leaders and other concerned people in response to yet another death by suicide of a Bath youth.

In October, Midcoast Community Alliance was formed with 34 members to address the high rate of youth suicide, substance use disorder, and other youth challenges, like depression and despair in Coastal Sagadahoc County.



Merrymeeting Support Collaborative for Youth Experiencing Homelessness becomes part of MCA.



MCA assumes operation of the Bath Youth Meeting House and Skate Park, formerly part of the Bath Parks and Recreation Department.

The name is changed to include dba Midcoast Youth Center.

Maine WCC targets communities with significant economic need.

MINIMUM POPULATION OF 1,900

Make WCC eligible to communities without a large city or town in close geographic or market proximity to a larger place.





Cross-sector team of leaders from private, public, non-profit, and community working toward an ambitious shared goal;



Engagement of community members in setting direction and decision-making;



Economic inclusion, racial equity, and diversity across age, gender, and sexual orientation an important part of process and shared goal;



System solutions, not just programs, to achieve team's shared goal;



Learning and adaptation through research, data, and peer exchange;



Connections to ideas, people, and markets within and across local economies and communities.

REACTIVE

Programs for young adults ages 16-24 interested in discovering their unique potential and developing basic life skills with coordinated support, employers, organizations, cities and towns, and community members who want to help young people thrive.



PROACTIVE

Equitable access to youth programs starting at an early age, increased access to health care, support for families, and creating stepping stones for development.


